Mary's Meals: A Simple Solution to World Hunger







About Mary's Meals

Now in its 23rd year, Mary's Meals is a global movement that sets up school feeding programs in some of the world's most vulnerable communities, where conflict, poverty and hunger often prevent children from gaining an education. Mary's Meals works with local volunteers to provide one daily nutritious meal in a place of learning to attract children into the classroom to receive an education. This simple solution to help end world hunger also enables children to lift themselves from the cycle of hunger and poverty.

Mary's Meals began by feeding 200 children in Malawi in 2002. Today, the organization feeds more than 3 million children every school day in over 5,800 schools across in the following countries: Benin, Ecuador, Ethiopia, Haiti, India, Kenya, Lebanon, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Mozambique, South Sudan, Syria, Yemen, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. Mary's Meals is part of the School Meals Coalition, an emerging initiative of governments and partners to drive actions that can urgently reestablish, improve, and scale up food and education systems. Our Story

Since 1992, <u>Magnus MacFarlane-Barrow</u> had been collecting and delivering relief supplies from Scotland to Bosnia for a decade when a trip to Malawi became the spark for his life's work that ignited a global movement.

In Malawi in 2002, Magnus met Edward, one of six children, quietly surrounding their dying mother on an earthen floor. As Magnus spoke with Edward, his words became the catalyst for Mary's Meals.

"I asked him, 'What are your hopes, what is your ambition?' recounts Magnus. He said, 'I want to have enough food to eat, and I want to be able to go to school one day.' And that was it. That was all of his ambition at 14 years of age."

Adds Magnus, "And it was really his words that prompted the birth of Mary's Meals." By feeding children where they learn, they can gain an education that can help break the cycle of poverty.

Current Hunger and Education facts

- In 2025, World Food Programme <u>estimates</u> 318 million people across 68 countries are facing acute hunger.
- A 2024/5 UNESCO-led Education <u>report</u> estimates that in 2023, 251 million children were out of school and of that number, more than <u>71 million</u> were primary-age children.
- The <u>2025 Global Report on Food Crises</u> estimates 37.7 million children in 26 countries/territories suffer from acute malnutrition.
- In its 2024 Poverty, Prosperity, and Planet Report, the World Bank Group reports that almost 700 million people live in extreme poverty-less than \$2.15 per day.
- Africa has the world's youngest population, with over 41% of people in Sub-Saharan Africa under age 15 (Statista).
- According to UNESCO 2023 report, 98 million children in Sub-Saharan Africa are out of school (UNESCO 2023).
- In 2025, Mary's Meals <u>expanded</u> across Africa, reaching 450,000 more children with daily school meals. We now serve 2.7 million children every school day through <u>10 (of 16)</u> <u>programs</u> in sub-Saharan Africa.

Milestones

- Mary's Meals feeds 3 million children in over 5,800 schools across 16 countries.
- In 2025, Mary's Meals scaled its program in 8 countries to reach 462,000 more children.
- In February 2025, Magnus addressed world leaders at Pope Francis' Summit on Children's Rights at the Vatican, where he introduced the concept of a child's "Right to Hope."
- In fall 2024, Mary's Meals doubled its program to feed 110,000 children in Tigray, Ethiopia.
- In 2023, Mary's Meals received Spain's prestigious <u>Princess of Asturias Award for Concord</u> for its work in defending and advancing human rights.
- Magnus MacFarlane-Barrow was honored as one of CNN's Top Ten Heroes in 2010.
- In 2015, Time Magazine recognized Magnus as one of the <u>Top 100 Most Influential People</u>.
- Pope Francis blessed the work of Mary's Meals and urges school feeding to continue.
- The charity is named after Mary, the mother of Jesus, and is a fruit of Medjugorje.
- Magnus is the best-selling author of The Shed That Fed 2 Million Children and Give.
- 2022 was the 20th anniversary of Mary's Meals.
- Mary's Meals USA is one of 20 national affiliate countries supporting school feeding programs in 16 countries.
- Where possible, locally-sourced food, suppliers, and fuel is used to help the local economy.
- This simple, local-managed school feeding model is scalable and cost-effective. It costs just \$25.20 .13 cents per meal to feed a child for an entire school year.
